- c) employees of Public Administrations, who may benefit from the leave provided for by collective bargaining for the normal duration of the course or, for employees under public law, extraordinary leave for study purposes, compatibly with the needs of administration, pursuant to art. 2 of the law n. 476 of 13 August 1984, and subsequent amendments, with or without scholarship and unless explicitly waived, only if they are enrolled for the first time in a PhD course, regardless of the disciplinary context;

Admission to the PhD program includes:

a) EVALUATION OF THE CURRICULUM, THE RESEARCH PROJECT AND PUBLICATIONS.

The evaluation will be carried out on the basis of the criteria established in advance by the Commission of selection.

The research project must:

- ✓ contain a maximum of 20,000 characters;
- ✓ be accompanied by references to specific documentary, bibliographic, analytical and critical sources;
- ✓ refer to the research methodologies and techniques appropriate to its development and must be divided into the following sections:

- ✓ Name of the candidate
- ✓ Title of the research

b) ORAL EXAMINATION

Oral examination:

SCORES ATTRIBUTABLE TO THE INDIVIDUAL TESTS	 The Commission has a total of 100 points, distributed as follows: ✓ evaluation of the curriculum, the research project and publications: 60/100; ✓ evaluation of the oral exam: 40/100 Only candidates who achieved a score of not less than 40/60 in the evaluation of the curriculum, of the research project and of publications, will be admitted to the oral exam; the oral exam is considered passed if the candidate has achieved a vote of not less than 25/40; at the end of the oral exam, the Commission prepares the general merit ranking by adding for each candidate the score reported in the individual tests; Candidates with a minimum overall score of 65/100 will be declared eligible for the Competition. 		
CALENDAR OF EXAMINATIONS	The date, time and manner of carrying out the oral examination will be made known at least 10 days in advance by publishing a notice in the "Calls and Competitions" and "PhD" sections of the University website. By means of this notice, the fulfillment of the disclosure of the documents is deemed to be completed, therefore such publication will be valid as notification of the convocation. Candidates for the admission are therefore required to arrive on the day and at the time indicated without waiting for further personal communications on the matter, with a valid identity document. The absence of the candidate on the scheduled day and time will be considered as a formal renunciation of participation in the Competition.		
COURSE ENROLLMENT FEE	Supernumerary candidates declared eligible and admitted to the Course are required, upon enrollment, to pay the <u>annual contribution of € 5,000.00 (five thousand euro)</u> . The payment of the regional tax is added to this contribution. The recipients of the scholarship are also required to pay the regional tax. The contribution to be paid by foreign citizens, eligible in the general merit ranking, and who do not compete for the scholarship, will be quantified with a specific resolution by the competent Academic Bodies. The contributions paid will not be returned in any circumstances.		
TRAINING OBJECTIVES	The PhD intends to address all the sciences of the humanistic sector: literar linguistic, philosophical, philological, psychological, pedagogical, sociological are historical. On the linguistic level, it is planned to deepen the research in the field of diachronic linguistics (with references to the "external history" of language and sociolinguistics also in terms of linguistic variation) and synchronic linguistic considered from the point of view of the structure of systems, of their typology, of the underlying cognitive principles and the principles and parameters that govern their communicative execution; particular attention will be given to neurolinguistic studies, meant as the study of the neurobiological correlates that govern the organization and transformation of language systems. On the psychological level, the objectives are multiple: one concerns the study of the relationships between emotions, motivations and cognitive processes normality and psychopathology. dispositions to action and of the cognitive orientation implied by individual emotions; knowledge of the main theories of motivation, instinctual and finalistic, the different classifications of the main motivations and the related critical aspects; a knowledge of the most important cognitive processes, such as reasoning and heuristics. A second objective is the study of behaviors related to the organization of the sleep-wake cycle in relation to emotional, motivational and cognitive processes in normality and psychopathology. This implies: the application of different clinical and non-clinical research designs. A third objective is the study of brain plasticity in physiology and pathology: the brain's ability to change in response to experiential events and/or accidental domains. This implies: the use of various methods ranging from human research models to basic research models.

On the sociological level, and in particular the sociology of deviance, it identifies the analysis of emotions and passions in the light of the acquisitions of neuroscience towards the concept of normality in human behavior, as well as in the processes of communication and symbolization that influence actions and the way of seeing reality.

The transversal educational objective of the PhD is the in-depth study of the methodologies of empirical research in the linguistic, psychological, social sciences and in education.

- sociolinguistics, with particular reference to historical sociolinguistics and contact between languages;
- typological linguistics, with particular reference to the relationships between typology and historical linguistics and to the systems of the parts of speech;

- the relationships between motivations, emotions and cognitive processes in non-clinical individuals and in those suffering from psychopathology, in particular, depression, anxiety disorders, eating disorders, obsessive compulsive disorder, dissociative disorders, PTSD;
- the processes of maintenance and aggravation of psychopathology;
- the processes of acceptance and commitment;
- use of new technologies for the study of normal and pathological mental condition;
- progress in the study of consciousness;
- creativity and mental processes that generate creative intuitions: "creative", "productive", "lateral" and "divergent" thinking;
- theories of knowledge and metacognitive processes;
- phenomenology of the limit: transition phenomenon or "threshold phenomenon";
- the ego, the "shadow" and the "limit situations";

If the Researcher chooses the path of psychology, he or she will be provided with deep knowledge of emotions, motivations, cognitive processes and their interaction both in the context of normality and in that of clinical psychology; he or she will also have acquired adequate skills in research methodology with particular reference to experimentation and psychometry.
